

PARENT CONFERENCES

The common interest of teachers and parents is the well-being and development of the child. A good parent-teacher conference provides an avenue of communication and establishes a working relationship between the home and the school. Through parent-teacher conferences the teacher learns of the student's home background. The parent has an opportunity to know the teacher, how the student works, and their relationship with other children.

Parent teacher conferences will be held at the end of the first nine weeks and the end of the third nine weeks. Teachers should give a frank appraisal of the student's progress, using samples of the student's work. Teachers should notify parents frequently about students that are doing poor work.
